SUNDAY SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

April 5, 2020 – Passion (Palm) Sunday: The journey of Holy Week begins with the liturgy. While we listen to Matthew's version of the passion, we embrace a week made holy by its celebration of the Lord's gift of himself to us and everyone. (Matthew 21: 1-11/26: 14-27)

April 12, 2020 – Easter Sunday: Can we commit ourselves to being a "life-giver" as Jesus was? Christ's resurrection fills us with joy. It also animates us to go beyond being a believer. It asks us to do our Christianity and follow Jesus in being a "life-giver." (John 20: 1-9)

April 19, 2020 – 2nd Sunday of Easter: Our culture and turmoil in society pose challenges to faith and provoke questions that begin with: "How can God allow . . .?" This Sunday, especially, reminds us that the gift of faith comes from God's infinite mercy. (John 20: 19-31)

April 26, 2020 – 3rd Sunday of Easter: On our personal road to Emmaus, the risen Christ seems to come unfamiliar in appearance. We recognize Christ on the cross, but it is more difficult to recognize and see the Christ disguised in our everyday lives. We are more apt to see Christ in others if we try to be Christ to others. (Luke 24: 13-35)

Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him.

For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him.

In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Come you all: enter into the joy of the Lord.


