SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS - AUGUST 2019

August 4, 2019 – 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Sometimes, we attempt to make our world a personal paradise forgetting the eternal paradise for everyone we have been promised. In the Gospel, Jesus tells a parable emphasizing what true security is and where it can be found. *(Luke 12: 13-21)*

August 11, 2019 – 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Part of preparing for the coming of God's kingdom is to acknowledge our sinfulness and ask forgiveness of God and others. We can do this now, confident that we will be waiting with a clean heart when the Lord returns. Jesus stresses the need to be ready for his return. *(Luke 12:37-48)*

August 18, 2019 – 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time: God wills our salvation, but we must cooperate with him. In the Gospel, Jesus declares that his message will be the cause for conflict and division among families. *(Luke 12: 49-53)*

August 25, 2019 – 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time: Jesus teaches that the narrow gate can be entered only by zealous and disciplined effort and not be desire alone. The Lord requires us to live lives of discipline and zeal so that we can spend eternity with him. Let us seek forgiveness for the times we have failed to do so. *(Luke 13: 22-30)*
