## **Sunday Scripture Reflections**

**September 5, 2021 – 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Isaiah's prophecy finds fulfillment in Jesus, who goes about healing the needy and poor. James reminds us that the poor have been chosen by God to be rich in faith. How can we show God's loving concern for persons who are materially or spiritually poor? (Isaiah 35:4-7a, James 2:1-5, Mark 7:31-37)

**September 12, 2021 – 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:** In this Sunday's oracle from Isaiah, the servant of the Lord declares: "I have not rebelled, have not turned back." The servant has his cross and – obeying Jesus' exhortation – we have ours. One aspect of our cross is to do good deeds. With James, I want to "demonstrate my faith...from my works." (Isaiah 50:4c-9a, James 2:14-18, Mark 8:27-35)

**September 19, 2021 – 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:** This Sunday's passage from the Book of Wisdom seems like a preview of Jesus' passion, which he foretells in the Gospel. And the excerpt from James resembles a commentary on the disciples' rivalry, which is also described in the Gospel. Lord, help us to avoid jealousy and selfish ambition, which make you suffer so much! (Wisdom 2:12,17-20, James 3:16-43, Mark 9:30-37)

**September 26, 2021 – 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:** This Sunday's readings call our attention to two vices: jealousy and greed. Joshua wants Moses to stop two men from prophesying, but Moses instead wishes that all the people would prophesy. In the Gospel, John wants to prevent someone who isn't a disciple of Jesus from expelling demons. The second reading focuses on the vice of avarice. Lord, help us to examine our lives in regard to these capital sins. (Numbers 11:25-29, James 5:1-6, Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48)
